Mathematics Competency Exam Information

(Next Exam to be Held on Wednesday, August 27, 2014)

To satisfy the requirement you must have accomplished one of the following:

- SAT Math score of 500 or above
- ACT math subtest score of 20 or above
- PSSA scores of Proficient or Advanced on the Grade 11 Mathematics Exam
- ESU competency exam score of 19 or above
 - o Can only be attempted three times
 - \circ Score range include 0 32
- Transfer math course which transfers as a general education mathematics course and which was taken within 5 years of enrolling at ESU and with a grade of C- or better
- AP or CLEP test that transfers as an ESU Math course
- Earned Bachelor's degree
- MATH 090 at ESU with a grade of S (for satisfactory)

If you take the competency exam, a minimum of 19 is needed to satisfy the Math Competency Requirement. You are permitted to take the exam a total of three times. The ESU Math Department offers the test twice each semester (during the first week and at some point in the middle of the semester). Sample questions are available on the ESU Math Department website: <u>http://www4.esu.edu/academics/departments/mathematics/competency_exam.cfm</u>.

Another way to satisfy the competency requirement is to take and pass the course, MATH 090. If you are unsuccessful with the competency exam during the next academic year, it is recommended that you take the course in fall 2015.

The next testing sessions will be held on Wednesday, August 27th at 2 p.m. and 7 p.m. in Abeloff Center for the Performing Arts. You can register to take the competency exam by calling the ESU Mathematics Department Secretary, Christine Getz, at (570) 422-3447.
