<p>Eligibility?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All graduate and undergraduate students are eligible to submit research or scholarly activity conducted or completed between January 1, 2013 and March 2014. • Projects prepared by more than one student qualify (and are encouraged). Standard quantitative and qualitative research qualifies. • Scholarly and entrepreneurial activity from any field qualifies. • Work in progress may be submitted if it will be completed before April 3.

<p>Joint faculty/student projects?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The focus of this symposium is <i>student</i> work, however, student-faculty collaborative projects are eligible provided the student <i>significantly</i> contributed to the entire research process. • <i>Significant contribution</i> includes, but is not limited to, assisting with the formulation of the research problem, development of the study design, participating in data collection and analysis, synthesis of the results, conclusions, discussion and the final written report/presentation.
<p>Process?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The submission must come from a student. • However, the student must be sponsored by a faculty member or program director, and must be selected by a department or program. • Each department or program should develop its own process with internal deadlines to select up to 6 "submissions." • Any time up to 4 pm on March 14, students can submit their 75 word abstracts and other information to the submission site. • The link to the submission site has been provided to department chairs/program directors. • The department/program provides the link to the selected students. • The program brochure will identify the student presenters, sponsoring faculty member and department.

Format?	<p>Students may elect to present in a variety of formats</p> <p>Posters</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Conference style poster presentations receive preference.• There are approximately 75 poster slots for each of the two poster sessions.• Students are encouraged to submit their work on academic-style posters.• If you have not already created the poster, we are asking that you limit the size to a vertically-oriented poster not more than 3 feet wide by 4-5 feet tall.• Most of our display units are 6 feet tall and 3 feet wide.• We suggest you attend the poster design session on March 13 from 2-4 in Monroe Hall - B01 for advice.• If you have already created a poster larger than 3'x4' (for example, to meet dimensional criteria of a conference, competition or class), we can accommodate some of these. We will need the dimensions.• We also have easels where foam core board or some other stiff backing will be needed to mount the poster and wall space where posters can be single unsupported sheets of paper <p>PowerPoint/Prezi</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Limited space is available for short PowerPoint or Prezi-supported explanations, live demonstrations, and panels.• PowerPoint/Prezi-style presentations will run in one hours sessions in several classrooms from 1-2 and 2-3 pm. Each presentation should be 10-12 minutes long. With 10 minutes for moderated questions.• Priority for these sessions will be given to completed projects, graduate students, and to Sigma Xi competitors <p>Table Displays.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• We can arrange for table displays where tri-folds and other objects can be placed. We will need some details about what you plan to display. <p>Other formats.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• We are interested in exploring ways to accommodate innovative formats.• We will need some details about what you plan to display.
