Human Impacts on Watershed Processes

Description:

We invite paper submissions for the 2010 AAG meeting in Washington, D.C. for the session "Human Impacts on Watershed Processes". We seek papers that examine the impacts of human landscape disturbances (such as land use/land cover change from urbanization or resource extraction, livestock grazing, etc.) or "natural" disturbances that may be facilitated or augmented by human activities (e.g., wildfire, invasive plants, and floods) on the hydrological, ecological or geomorphic processes at watershed scale. Papers that use modeling to study these watershed processes are also encouraged. This session will be oral presentations.
