East Stroudsburg University of Pennsylvania

- East Stroudsburg University will present a free program on preventing hazing from 7 to 8 p.m., today, in Stroud Hall 113. This will be the first day of Hazing Prevention Week. The university's police chief will present the program to the campus and community.
- A pair of film screenings will be held this week as part of the Latino Heritage Month Film Festival at East Stroudsburg University. *Wilaya* (2012), a film directed by Pedro Pérez Rosado, will be shown at 7 p.m., tomorrow, and *Clandestine Childhood/Infancia clandestina* (2012), a film directed by Benjamin Ávila, at 7 p.m., Thursday. - The Edinboro University Department of History, Anthropology and World Languages, in collaboration with 150th Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry "Bucktails," will present "Remembering Gettysburg and Beyond," a commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg and the Emancipation Proclamation, beginning Tuesday and continuing through Sunday. The presentation of a Civil War encampment on the Edinboro campus from Friday through Sunday by about 75 members of the "Bucktails" and guests from similar organizations will culminate the near-weeklong program of activities.
