The Inclusion Poster Project at East Stroudsburg University is a student art-and-design exhibit that aims to foster dialogue about how our scholarly community can promote inclusion and diversity. This innovative project empowers students to model civil dialogue, spark courageous conversations, and create a campus without walls. ESU is one of the most diverse schools in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. The Project challenges undergraduates to work collaboratively to engage the cultural, social, and educational differences that make our campus unique.


Consistent with ESU's values of intellectual integrity, freedom of expression, good citizenship, and accountability, students studied inclusion as a concept in academic literature, inventoried campus spaces from a first-person perspective, and co-designed images and messages that would contribute to inclusive excellence on our campus. The project, now in its second year, is a cross-disciplinary collaboration between students in Philosophy 340: Race, Gender and Culture (taught by Professor T Storm Heter) and students in Art 220: Graphic Design (taught by Professor David Mazure). The Inclusion Poster Project is cosponsored by the Office of the Provost and the Diversity and Inclusion Committee.

Does this happen to men, too?


