GRADUATE STUDENT RESEARCHER (GSR) SUMMER 2024 APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The Office of Graduate and Extended Studies, together with the Office of Sponsored Projects and Research, would like to support the research enterprise at ESU by offering two, ½ time Graduate Student Researcher - funded positions for summer 2024.

This is a competitive application process for a faculty member and a select graduate student to apply for a paid research position.

The position is for the summer, beginning May 13 and ending August 23 (15 weeks), for 10 hours a week at a pay of \$10/hour. This is a summer opportunity only.

The requirements of the position are that the graduate student must have direct and substantial involvement in a research or creative project – short or long term – in your department, that it will substantially enhance the student's learning potential by said involvement, and that you, the faculty member, will mentor this student's work. The proposal should not be to support a student's thesis work.

To Apply:

- 1. Visit <u>ESU eGRANTS</u>; Log in or register (Contact Lynne Ozgur, <u>lozgur@esu.edu</u> for questions about the portal). The faculty member should submit the application.
- 2. Click on the **Graduate Student Researcher (GSR) Summer 2024** link on the homepage.
- 3. Complete the information in the application form online: The *ESU eGRANTS* application must include the name and contact information of the faculty member who will lead the endeavor (applicant), title of research project, a timeframe, the number of hours (10/week), and the name, major, and contact information of the student.
- 4. Upload Proposal (Word doc or PDF), a **3-4 paragraph** justification for the position which if chosen will become the student's job description. The proposal shall not exceed one page.

Applications are due in <u>ESU eGRANTS</u> by **Midnight, Monday, April 22, 2024**. Review time will be swift with expected announcement made by May 6.

Criteria for selection are:

- 1. Student's level of substantial involvement in the project
- 2. Clear impact on student's education and future career aspirations
- 3. Depth of faculty member's commitment to mentor student

If chosen, the student will have to apply immediately to a job description that will be posted in Atlas.
