Subject: Message to ESU Students Regarding CARES Act Funding

Dear Warriors,

ESU would like to remind you that we have some additional funding available to help students who are enrolled in fall 2020 classes. As many of you now know, the U.S. Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act has distributed funding and, while following the guidelines established by the U.S. Department of Education, we want to help our Warriors get the education they seek.

You may apply again for this round of funding, even if you have received CARES Act funding in the past. The main goal of the CARES Act is to help students/families who are experiencing COVID-19 related hardships that pertain to a student's educational endeavor. If you are experiencing difficulty paying your tuition, books, food, housing, etc. due to a COVID-19 related reason, I encourage you to submit an application.

A few notes:

Students must be Title IV eligible to receive federal funds, as determined by the 2020-2021 FAFSA (studentaid.gov). This includes, but is not limited to, being a citizen or eligible non-citizen in a degree-seeking program of study, and meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). ESU's CARES Act application is currently open until Friday, November 20, 2020 at 4:30 p.m. and can be accessed by visiting <https://www.esu.edu/financial-aid/cares-act.cfm>. If you have submitted an application in the past few weeks, no need to submit another. Applications will be processed as they are submitted; however, please give the review team between two and four weeks to respond to your application. Notification of award will be made soon after. We guarantee that all applications will be reviewed; however, there is no guarantee that your request will be fulfilled.
