ROLE

- Make recommendations to the University president in almost all areas except for:
- Personnel issues;
- Departmental-level curriculum issues;
- The day-to-day operations of departments, divisions, or groups;
- Issues related to the application of policies to specific individuals, or;
- Matters subject to collective bargaining.

AGENDA

- Agenda is established at the Senate Executive Board Meeting the last Monday of every month. Send Agenda items before this meeting.
- Anyone can send agenda items.
- If five senators collectively send an agenda item, the item will make the agenda.

UNIVERSITY SENATE EVALUATION COMMITTEE

- Every five to seven years, there shall be a University Senate Evaluation Committee composed of five senators and whose purpose is to evaluate and assess the performance and functioning of the University Senate.
- Our last evaluation was in 2023.
- Committee is disbanded after the evaluation
