In-Paper Citations

Chicago style uses superscripts (¹) to mark citations in the text:

Ex. Sweig argues that Castro and Che Guevara were not the only key players in the Cuban Revolution of the late 1950s.¹⁷

*Note: For three or more authors, list the first author followed by a comma and *et al.* or *and others* in the footnote. In the bibliography, list all the authors' names.
